A SMALL AMOUNT OF MONEY CAN GO A LONG WAY



Over the last 2 years our innovative Cash4Graft matching grants programme has been helping to strengthen our local communities. With over 70 awards of £250 made in Bolton, Oldham and Trafford, Cash4Graft has been the spark that turns ideas into realities, skills into actions and people into community builders.

The Cash4Graft programme is designed to break down the bureaucracy typically associated with funding applications. It encourages residents who wouldn't usually apply for funding to gain access to money to help turn their ideas into reality and kick-start projects to benefit the wider community.

Independent research into the effectiveness of the Cash4Graft initiative has recently been conducted based on the 70 awards made since August 2012.

Key findings include:

- 87% of recipients found the awards easy to apply for.
- 80% of projects supported have continued since the initial £250 was spent (36% of these financed further activities through selffundraising).
- 75% of recipients stated that their idea wouldn't have been realised without the Cash4Graft initiative.
- 62.5% of recipients hadn't previously received funding.
- 61% stated that £250 was the correct amount to be offered.

The main outcome of the Cash4Graft initiative was that it helped build connections and brought people together within a neighbourhood. As a result, the research found that there was an improvement in mental and physical wellbeing, building of community pride, an increase in intergenerational mixing, sharing of knowledge and skills, and creation of safer neighbourhoods and employment opportunities.

To help us to continue to support local neighbourhoods through our Cash4Graft initiative we need further investment.

JIM JAM GIRLS - OLDHAM

The Jim Jam Girls project in Alt, Oldham sources fruit from the local primary school's orchard, the green route to school (a Forever Manchester funded project to make the neighbourhood greener) and residents' gardens to make jams. Supported by a £250 Cash4Graft award, jars and cooking equipment were purchased but all the fruit is sourced locally and people's time donated for free.

The girls sell jam, lemon curd and apple sauce for £2 and reinvest the profits into the project to buy more jars. Not only is the project economically self-sustainable it has also attracted attention from the Naked Bean Café in Oldham Library which provides an additional outlet to sell more. The group has agreed that any additional surplus will be reinvested in the local community centre.

Starting with a small unintimidating amount of money gave the girls a chance to develop their project management skills as the project grew naturally.

This project illustrates how far £250 can go. Not only does the project sustain itself, it has developed into the beginnings of a social enterprise that benefits the wider community.
